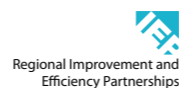

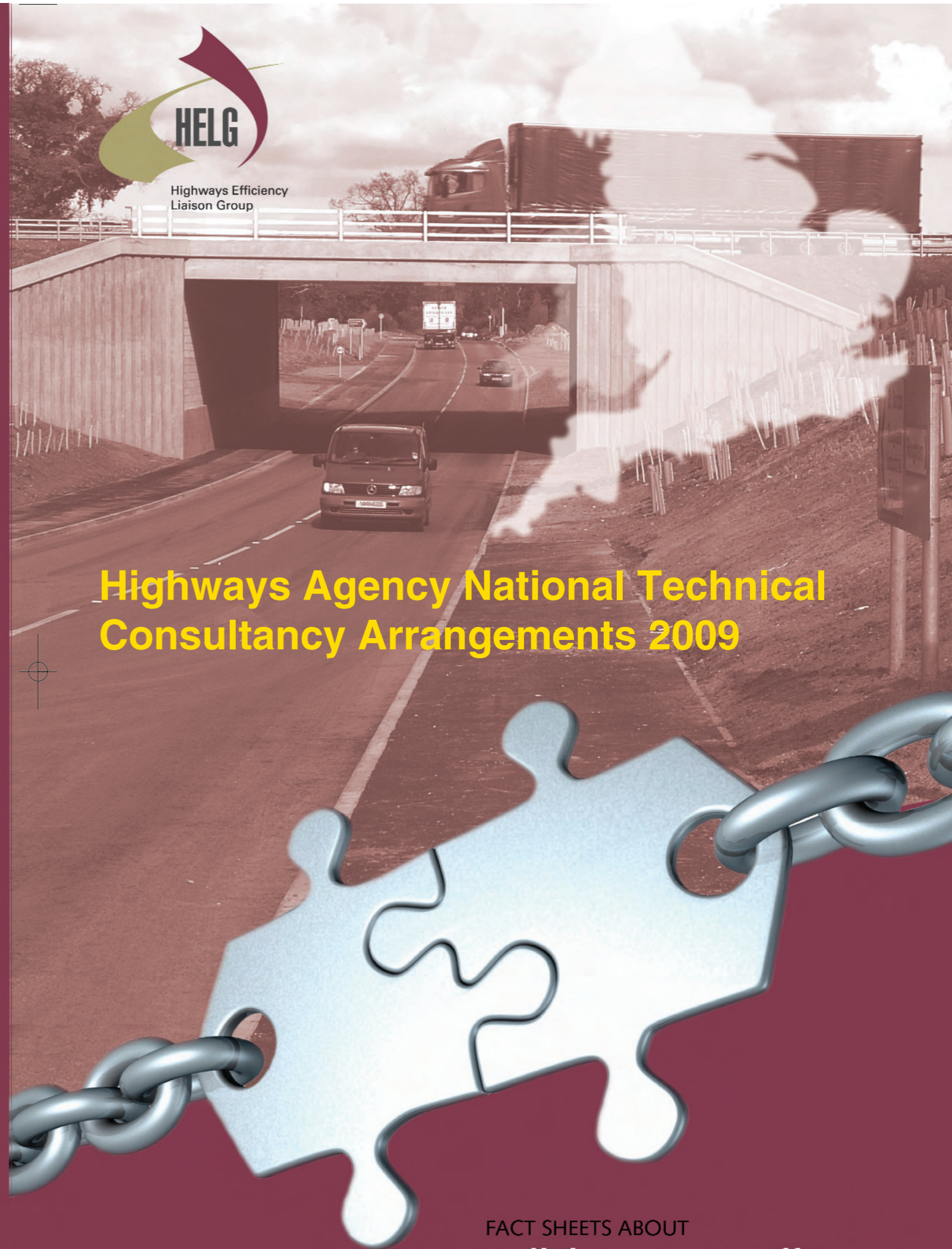

Highways Agency National Technical Consultancy Arrangements 2009 - 2011

What is this Framework for?

The Highways Agency National Technical Consultancy Arrangements 2009 – 2011 contract 2/1308 was awarded in July 2009, as a like for like temporary replacement for the National Framework Contracts 2/666 and 3/387, to be active for a duration of 18 months, with the potential to extend by a further 12 months. The contract can be used to provide both technical advice and research and development work. Whilst support on a project may be needed for several years, an individual task order will generally be awarded to cover a 9 to 12 month period.

What can I get done under this Framework?

This Framework Contract covers a diverse portfolio of specialist services, including;

- Provision of advice, courses, training, literature reviews, desk studies, scoping / feasibility studies, computer simulation / modelling, laboratory modelling and testing, collection of data, analysis and management support on current systems, standards, libraries, regulations, strategies, technologies, design, materials, structures and equipment.

- Establishment and monitoring of site trials / pilots
- Advise, review, amend or development of manuals, documents, models, databases, techniques and standards
- Provision of technical and administrative assistance
- Maintenance and operation IT systems / databases as required
- Development and implementation of innovative engineering and traffic management techniques

Who supplies these services?

There are five Suppliers (referred to as key Suppliers) on the Framework. Key suppliers may nominate the services of sub-consultant personnel with suitable qualifications from a comprehensive supply chain of consultants.

The key suppliers are:

What will these services cost?

There are six staff grades within the Framework, used by all Suppliers. The table shows indicative rates for these grades. The actual rate charged will depend on the Supplier selected.

Indicative average staff rates table

3.	Chartered Grade - £51.84
4.	Assistant Chartered Grade - £41.59
5.	Graduate Grade - £34.17
6.	Technician – £26.24

Access

How do I access the Framework?

Identify a project and the funds required to complete it. Produce a specification that includes the definition of key milestone events. Identify your preferred Supplier and provide a justification for the selection of that Supplier.

Send these documents to the HA Framework Board.

The Framework Board will request a proposal from the nominated Supplier. This will require contact between you and preferred Supplier in order to clarify requirements and time scales.

When you are content, notify the Framework Board who in turn will notify the Supplier that their proposal has succeeded.

During the project, the Supplier must complete monthly progress reports.

If there are changes to project scope, project cost or agreed timescales, then you and your Supplier must agree these prior to work continuing.

The Supplier will submit invoices directly to you (not the HA) for payment. You must pay within 30 days of receipt of invoice unless you dispute the invoice. (Note that the Highways Agency operates a prompt payment initiative where payment is made within 30 days of receipt of invoice.)

On completion, assess the performance of the Supplier and send your report to the Framework Board.

You and the Supplier will be expected to actively participate in the Framework Client/Supplier Community. This forum will engender the spirit of partnering and continual improvement within the Clients and Supply Chain. This is a key element of success.

Each project is subject to the Terms and Conditions of the Framework. The "Contract" for any specific project is between you and the Supplier.
